Free school uniform and support for your child!!

As you may know we receive funding from the Government to provide additional support for every child who is registered for Free School Meals. This funding doesn't just provide your child with free school meals but is also used to enhance your child's whole primary school experience, including pastoral and educational needs. If your child is eligible they will attract this support every year, for the whole of their time at primary school, even if your situation subsequently changes. Universal Infant Free School Meals is different to Free School Meals and does not attract this same support and funding.









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If your child is in Reception, KS1 or KS2 and you think your child/ren may be eligible for Free School Meals and this support please check by logging on to www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals (you will also need your national insurance number). You can check your child's eligibility at any time and if you are not eligible today but your situation changes it is worth rechecking their eligibility.

If you have any questions about this support you can discuss it confidentially with Mrs Silins. We will fund a school jumper and tie for all children who are registered for Free School Meals from 1st September 2017

Letters Home

Please take the time to read letters carefully as they are our main way of keeping you informed about what is happening in school, all letters home can now be found on our Web site via the following link:

http://www.stmarystetbury.com/the-office/letters. If you are requested to complete a slip on any letter it makes life a lot easier for our office staff if the slips are returned promptly. This is also the case when sending money into school – this should be in a sealed envelope clearly labelled with your child's name, class, the amount of money and what the money is paying for.

Medication

Please ensure medication your child requires is handed into the school office at which point you will be asked to complete a Medication Form . Please do not send medication in with your child without seeing a member of staff and completing the form.

Absences

In order to continue to ensure the safety of your child/ren we will need contact from a responsible adult if your child is absent. This should be done via a telephone call to the school office, or popping into the school office if you are bringing other children into school. If we have no confirmation of their absence by 9.15am we will contact you via your home and emergency numbers to ensure your child is safe. This is a time consuming task for our busy office staff, so please remember to contact us! For safety's sake you need to contact the school each day your child is absent.









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Holiday/Absence Request

All requests must be made on a form available from the school office, for any time off of school other than illness. Unfortunately holidays cannot be authorised during school time and holidays taken will be marked as unauthorised. Please ask the school office if you are unsure of the Government's Policy on holidays taken during term time.

Appointments Medical/ Dentist etc

All appointments where possible should be made outside school hours. If your child has an appointment please bring a copy the appointment card/letter into the school office, so this can be put with the class register.

School Lunches and Parentpay

Reception children have now received their activation letter. The menu choices can be booked up to Christmas, so please do this as soon as possible as this helps with the registration process in the morning. (We do check on the day if your child is still having a school lunch or sandwiches, so you can change your mind!)

Milk

Reception Children whose parents have registered them for Free school milk (under 5's) are receiving milk in class at the moment, it is not an automatic registration. If you would like to take advantage of the free school milk scheme, please register your child at the link below. As the children turn five this will become chargeable and an invoice will be sent to the parent/carer from Coolmilk. If you do not want your child to receive milk in school, the parent/carer will need to cancel it. This should be done via Coolmilk. We are unable to do this in the school office.

There is also free milk for anyone entitled to free school meals. Please register via the link below.

Milk is available for children from when they are 5 years old through to Year 6 with payment being made to the company who organise the "Cool Milk for Schools". you can also access details at www.CoolMilk.co.uk).

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St Mary's Parent Teacher and Friends Association (PTFA)

Please support the PTFA! If you are interested in helping, please let us know your interest by emailing ptfa@st-marys-tetbury.gloucs.sch.uk or by attending the AGM on Tuesday 19th September (8pm at school).

The PTFA raise funds for the school which are not provided through formal funding. Last academic year we raised **£9842.**The committee are all parents of children at the school and we organise events and help at school functions on a volunteer basis in our free time. We are starting this year with a small group of volunteers of just 5 people. We represent just 5 families out of the approximately 200 families that attend St Marys School.

Unfortunately, we need more help to be able to put events such as the Christmas Fayre and Summer Fete. These events are our biggest fundraisers of the whole year and last year raised a total of nearly £6000.

These large events cannot be organised with just 5 people so please support the PTFA otherwise we must unfortunately discontinue the PTFA.

It would be a shame for the children not to experience fun events such as the termly school discos, the fayres, leavers party, dress-down days, leavers BBQ or ice-cream Fridays.

Joining the committee involves; attending meetings approximately every 6 weeks/2 months, helping at events, volunteering some time before the large events for preparation. However, you can volunteer to help at some events or just support us with an hour of your time every now and then.

Parent/Teacher Representative

St Marys PTFA have started a parent representative scheme. A parent volunteer liaises with the class teacher / TA to pass on information to all the parents in each class to ensure everyone is fully informed about activities within each class.

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A parent representative eases the responsibility on the teacher of reminding kids and parents about special events within the classroom; E.g.
