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Imam Hassans Visit

On Thursday the 24th January Ash, Elm, Oak had a treat. We had a visit from Imam Hassan, who talked about his religion- Islam. The people of his religion are called Muslims. He told us about the five pillars of Islam which are the foundation of his religion. These are called Shahadah, Sawm, Zakah, Salah and Hajj. The final pillar- Hajj- means that they have to go on a pilgrimage to a special place called Mecca at least once in their life (if they can afford it). They also call it the house of God. Imam Hassan showed us pictures of the mosque in Mecca which had capacity for about 4 million people. The mosque was a beautiful, grand building. Sawm (the third pillar), means Muslims have to fast for a month they call Ramadan because it reminds them of the poor people in the world. It also helps them to remember to be grateful for all that they have. We think it is very thoughtful and shows commitment to their religion. We are grateful that the teachers organised this visit because it helped us to understand Islam in more detail.

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quick first aid Head Lice Awareness

Head Lice are small, six-legged wingless insects about the size of a pin-head when fully grown and grey/brown in colour. Head Lice cannot jump or fly, they spread by clambering from one head to another so children can be most commonly infected through head to head contact during school or play.

Lice hang on tight to the hair, usually close to the scalp where there is warmth, food and shelter from detection. They feed by biting and sucking blood from their host and a female louse will lay eggs in sacs known as 'nits', these hatch within 7-10 days and the lice will then take another 6-14 days to become fully grown and then capable of reproduction. A head louse infection is annoying and sometimes uncomfortable but it is not harmful or dangerous.

A regular check by wet combing is recommended and lice can be treated easily with the various products that are available, however these will not guarantee protection against further infection at a later date, so continued weekly detection is recommended.

Please Note:
Head lice do not differentiate between Clean/Dirty Hair or Long/Short Hair, they just like to cling onto any hair and a nice warm and cosy head.
