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
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#### Year 4

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#### **Wellbeing Week**

As part of wellbeing week, Year 4 have been thinking about Mindfulness by noticing what is going on in our bodies and minds. We looked at the art of mandalas and how they have a special meaning to the person creating them

- a way of representing their thoughts, feelings, hopes and dreams. Using cotton buds and acrylic paint, we formed patterns on rocks by focusing on the size and shape of the stones to help our minds slow down. They all express something different and each one is unique and personal.











We have also thought about Connectivity during a session in Forest School. By noticing and connecting with nature, we have been able to work together and help each other to have a greater sense of wellbeing and belonging. Chestnut Class took time to study nature though sketching and then carefully tied sticks to create a natural frame for our pictures. It took some time and perseverance to get the twine tight enough but the finished frames and sketches were very effective.





Maple Class created mini rafts using natural materials from the forest school. The challenge was for the raft to be able to float with a lit candle on top. Everyone's raft was a success and the lit candles helped us to focus as we connected with nature around us.

On Tuesday, Year 6 had a brilliant time together at Bowood House and Gardens where they tackled the terrifying death slide, climbed high ropes and ladders and explored pitch –black caves and beautiful waterfalls. 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### Free school meals – apply now! Calling all year 2's ready for year 3 - its not too late!!

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, our school will received extra funding if your child is eligible.

The free school meals policy is as follows-

Children might be able to get free school meals if they or their parents get any of the following:

- \* Income Support
- \* income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- \* income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- \* support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- \* the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- \* Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- \* Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- \* Universal Credit your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)



Check to see if your child is eligible using the confidential online portal available on our website www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals fou can secure a tasty free meal for your child and save ourself up to £437 per year. Plus your child's school receives extra funding for each




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#### **Textile Recycler**
