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## Mrs Cartledge's KS1 Book Recommendations:

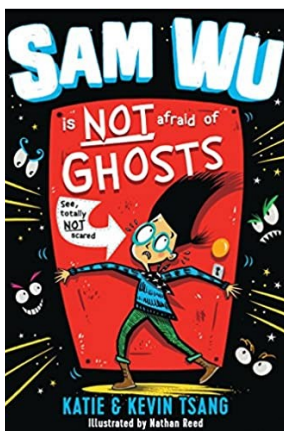
With Christmas just around the corner, here are some suggestions for some perfect Christmas presents!



Step out of your front door and begin a journey of discovery around the world! Fold out the richly illustrated pages of this expansive concertina book to clamber over mountain ranges, trek through jungles and sail across vast seas. Spot wildlife, visit amazing cities, experience different cultures and see famous landmarks as you whiz by.

With so much to explore on this globetrotting adventure, it's a good thing the book stretches to an incredible 2.5 meters long – you'll get halfway around the world before you even have to turn the page!

This is a gorgeous Christmas picture book that's destined to become a festive classic. Fox and Hare were born in spring, grew up in summer, and were best friends by autumn. When winter comes, they can't wait to jump, leap and, bounce in this thing called snow. But what exactly is snow? Join fox and hare on an Arctic journey as they ask all their friends to help them find out. This is a charming and classic-feeling Christmas picture book with a heartfelt message about seeing the wonder of the natural world. Families will love sharing the story and talking about kindness, community, and the true meaning of Christmas.



Part of the Sam Wu series, Sam is the bravest scaredy-cat in the world. In this hilarious, engaging story from start to finish, Sam is determined to prove his courage to his classmates, no matter what it takes - from adapting a snake that terrifies him to hunting ghosts to facing his sister's psychotic cat. 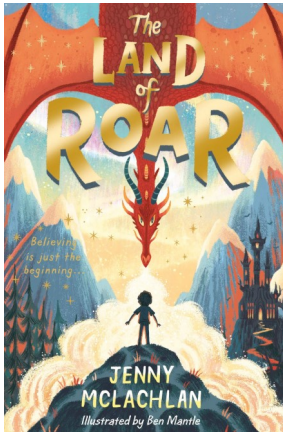
Another perfect book for early chapter readers with many other hilarious Sam Wu books to follow.



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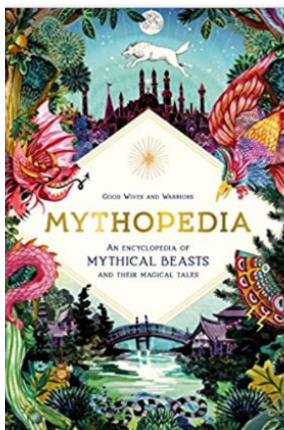
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## Mrs Cartledge's LKS2 Book Recommendations:



A superb and entirely magical adventure novel not to be missed. Be prepared to let your imagination run wild, as you enter 'The Land of Roar' alongside twins: Arthur and Rose, as they re-enter their childhood fantasy world full of dragons, mermaids, wizards and magic. With fantastic illustrations within each chapter, which bring the story to life, get ready to join them on their adventure into The Land of Roar. If you enjoyed this, be sure to devour book two of the series: 'Return to Roar'.

The Girl who Stole an Elephant will scoop you up and carry along on an unforgettable adventure through the jungle. Chaya, an outspoken, mischievous heroine, leads her friends and a gorgeous elephant through an exotic setting described wonderfully throughout. On the run from the royal palace, jewel chief and rebel, Chaya, must face up to revolutionary forces, untold dangers and her own misdemeanours in a battle for survival. A wonderfully evocative book about friendship, teamwork, loyalty and morality.



From the West African fable of Anansi the Spider, to Michabo, the magical hare who rebuilt the world and Tanuki, the sweet but troublesome racoon-dog of Japanese folklore, *Mythopedia* is an encyclopedia of mythical creatures that covers legends, tales and myths from around the world. Lovingly created by the illustration duo behind popular flipbook *Myth Match*, Good Wives and Warriors, this book contains pages upon pages of cultural folklore from around the world.

Let these weird and wonderful creatures spark your child's imagination for their own storytelling and drawing while teaching them about international cultures.





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## Mrs Cartledge's UKS2 Book Recommendations:

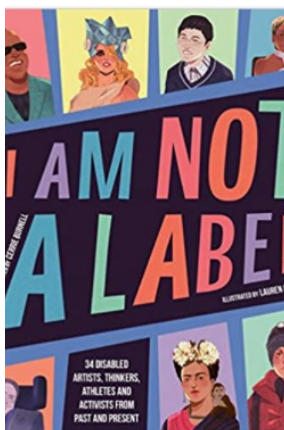
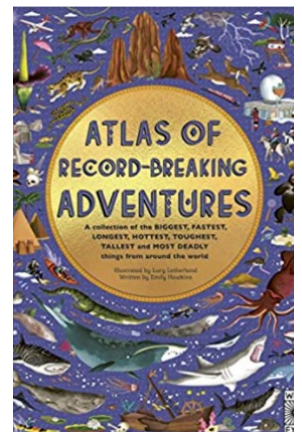

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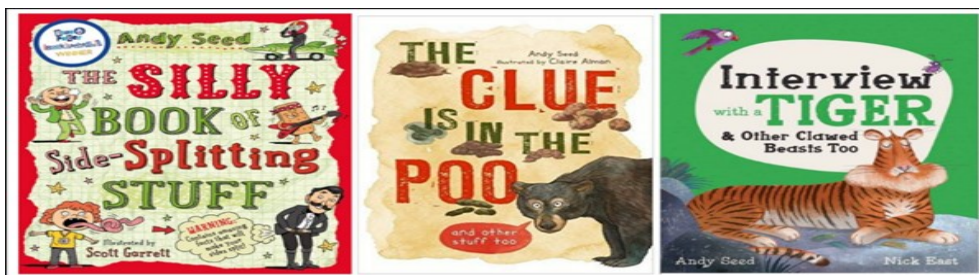
## EXCITING NEWS!
