<p>Geography: As part of our work on investigating where energy comes from, your task is to choose a method of energy production and create a fact file. Identify key facts surrounding your chosen resource, what it is commonly used for along with advantages and disadvantages of your choice.</p>	20 th January 2023
<p>Science: As part of our work on the circulatory system, your task is to create a 2-D or 3-D human highlighting the circulatory system. Make sure you label all parts of the body and the key component parts of the circulatory system. Make sure the presentation of your explanations is clear.</p>	3 rd February 2023
<p>Geography: Within our Geography topic we have looked at renewable energy sources. Your task is to create a “Champion” to promote the use of one of the renewable energy sources. You can come up with a catchphrase and costume. Remember, the idea is to be fun and engaging to promote the use of renewable energy.</p>	17 th February 2023
<p>History: As part of our work on World War 2, your task is to research wartime food and make/bake the recipe. Bring your food into school on this Friday so we can have a ‘class share’. Please ensure you label your food with the ingredients so we can check for allergies.</p>	10 th March 2023
<p>History: Whilst the men were off fighting in World War 2, there were lots of influential women who were keeping the country running at home. Your task is to research one, or a group of these women and present their fantastic contributions to the war effort.</p>	24 th March 2023
