

Maths We will continue to follow the 'White Rose' maths scheme by comparing numbers to 5, composition of 4 and 5, comparing mass and capacity. We will be counting to 6,7 and 8, making pairs and combining 2 groups. We will continue to use songs and actions to count forwards and backwards to 20.



Religious Education

We will be thinking about what we are good at and why we are special as we answer the big question 'Where do we belong?' We will learn about belonging to God's family and see a Baptism at the church. The 'C' at the heart of Collective Worship this term is 'Curiosity'.

Personal, Social, Emotional Development

Our topic is "Dreams and goals". We will discuss our dreams and goals and the importance of motivation and perseverance, working as a team, helping others and a positive attitude in order to achieve them.

Expressive Art and Design

We will be learning about waterproof materials, floating and sinking and then getting creative this term, learning about boats. We will design and make our own boats - let's hope they all float! We will continue to sing nursery rhymes and familiar songs as well as learning some new ones too. Children will have access to a range of role play areas to engage in imaginative play.

Literacy

We will be continuing to develop our reading and writing skills through RWI each day. This term we are reading 'Handa's Surprise' and 'Splash! Anna Hibiscus'. We will use the texts to sequence events, retelling the stories. We will also be writing lists and labelling pictures, using our Fred Fingers to help us spell words.



Communication & Language

The children will be listening to a wide range of stories, sequencing events and retelling stories. We will continue to practice our listening skills and focus on taking turns in a conversation.

Understanding the World

Through our weekly welly walks, we will be learning about the seasonal changes we can see.
