This book helps us learn about lifecycles. It will provide opportunities for sequencing and creating a story map.



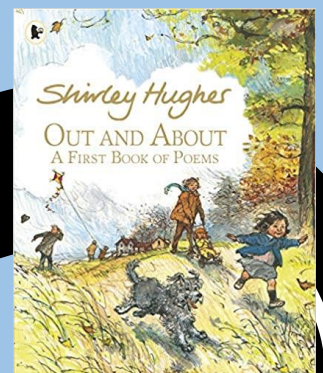
This book lends itself to supporting a mini topic about growing seeds and plants. We will write our own diaries, learning to write in a sequential manner.

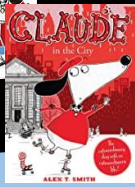


This book teaches us different ways to look after our planet and encourages us to recycle. We will duplicate the activity in the book and add leaves to our tree for everything we do to help our planet.

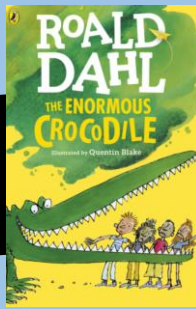

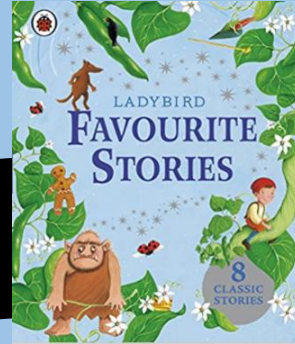

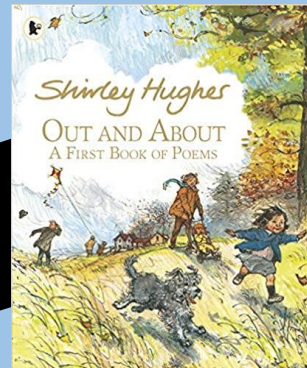


Year R Summer 2 Reading Road
