

## What is a knowledge organiser?

This is a document for you and your child to share over the course of the coming term. On this page you will find some key words, themes and questions for the children to explore. This should serve to enhance their in class learning.

## Key questions

How many seconds are in a minute? How many minutes are there in an hour? Can you tell the time at o'clock and half past?

What are the days of the week and months of the year and can you spell them?

What is the weather like today? (on the way to school).

What are the 4 Seasons? What are the clues and which Season is it now?

Where are the hot and cold regions of the world? Can you find it on a map (Google earth).

What are the 5 Senses? What parts of our body are used to get that information?

# Key scientific, geographical and mathematical Vocabulary:

A second	A unit of measuring time. There are <b>60 in one minute.</b>
A minute	A unit of measuring time. There are <b>60 minutes in 1 hour.</b>
An hour	A unit of measuring time. There are <b>24 hours in a day.</b>
A day	A unit of measuring time. There are <b>7 days in a week.</b>
Night	The time between one day and the next when it is dark.
Week	A time period of <b>seven days.</b>
Month	Any of the <b>twelve periods of time</b> into which the <b>year</b> is divided.
Year	A period of time that <b>starts on January 1<sup>st</sup> and ends on</b> <b>December 31<sup>st</sup></b> . A year can have 365 or, 366 days in it.
Weather	The conditions of the sky above us e.g. temperature, wind, rain or sun.
Seasons	Any of the four main periods of the year: spring, summer, autumn and winter.
North and south pole	The point at which the world is at its <b>furtherest North or</b> <b>South</b> . These are the <b>cold</b> regions of the earth.
Equator	An imaginary line around the earth at an <b>equal distance</b> <b>from the North and South Poles.</b> This is a <b>hot</b> region of the earth.
Senses	One of the five powers (sight, hearing, smell, taste and touch) that your body uses to get information about the world around you.

### Other key vocabulary:

#### key physical features, including:

Beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, and vegetation.

key human features, including: City, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop.
