England Northern Ireland Scotland Wales	The 4 countries that make up the UK
Atlantic ocean	Ocean to the north west of the UK
North sea	Sea to the east of the UK
Irish sea	Sea between the west coast of UK & Ireland
English channel	Sea between South of England and France

## KEY VOCABULARY – LINKED TO HISTORY

Fossil	Remains or traces of plants & animals that lived long ago.
Cliff	Tall steep rocks that have vertical (straight up & down) faces.
Beach	Sandy or gravelly part of the shore of an ocean.
Jurassic coast	An area found in the south of the UK.
Rocks	A hard material made up of one or more minerals.
Skeleton	A firm structure of a living thing typically made of bone.
Prehistoric	Before records were kept, before history.
Dinosaur	Animals found on earth more than 150 million years ago.
Paleontologist	A scientist who studies the remains of living things from long ago.
Preserved	To make sure something doesn't fall apart, is kept in the best state possible.
Ancient	Something or someone that is very old.
Ichthyosaurus	An extinct reptile like animal that lived in water.
