WELCOME BACK

Welcome back, we hope that you have enjoyed the Christmas break and kicked off the New Year in high spirits. This term, our focus will be on 'The Earth Beneath Our Feet.' We will be using this to look at the question: Would you prefer to live in a hot or cold country?

In Maths, we will be consolidating our learning of addition and subtraction skills in the first two weeks with a focus on using the partitioning method to work out more complex calculations. We will then transition onto multiplication and division for the remainder of the term.

Reading is still very important and we aim for children to be heard by an adult as often as we can. All children are heard in their phonics groups when we do guided reading. You may see a comment or a stamp in their reading records to show this.

In terms of homework we will be continuing to set the maths work booklets on a weekly basis (to complete a double page spread per week) and spellings to be learnt. Both of these activities will be reviewed on the Friday morning of each week as a whole class.
