Seasons There are four seasons each year, autumn,

winter, spring and summer.

Autumn In autumn, the weather begins to get colder. The leaves start to fall

from the trees. The mount of daylight becomes less.

Winter In winter, the weather is much colder. Deciduous trees lose their

leaves and have bare branches. The daytimes are the shortest of the

year and the night times are the longest.

Spring In spring, the weather starts to get warmer. Deciduous trees begin to

grow leaves again and some trees may blossom. Plants begin to grow

and you may see baby animals. The daytimes get longer.

Summer In summer, the weather gets hotter. The trees are full of leaves and

there are lots of flowers and insects. The daytime is long and the

night time is the shortest.

Weather The weather includes the temperature outside,

the wind direction and strength, as well as rain,

cloud and sun.
