Key Vocabulary:

Weather	The conditions of the sky above us e.g. temperature, wind, rain or sun.
Seasons	Any of the four main periods of the year: spring, summer, autumn and winter.
North and south pole	The point at which the world is at its furthest North or South . These are the cold regions of the earth. earth.
Temperature	the degree of heat or cold of an object or an environment. The temperature is higher in the afternoon than in the evening.
Subtract	To take away from a whole or larger amount.
Add	To put on or with something else to make larger or better.
Author	the writer of a book, play, story, or other written work.
Illustrator	an artist who makes illustrations for books or other written works.
Blurb	a short description written to promote or advertise a product, as on book covers (on the back).

Other key vocabulary:

Key physical features, including:

Hot and cold deserts, land, oceans, seas, clouds, rivers, lakes, continents and countries.

Key human features, including: City, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop.
