Not More Junk!

Junk mail is unwelcome post that drops through your letter box and might include menus, leaflets and flyers. Have a chat with an adult at home about the mail that is delivered to you.



How much junk mail does your household receive in one week? We would like you to record the number of unwanted items that are posted through your letter box each day, for one week. You can choose how to present your findings. A tally chart or a bar chart are just two ideas but you can be as creative as you like.

Make a pencil holder from items that you have at home - see ideas below.
