Dear Parents,

Year 6 have had a fantastic week at **Morfa Bay**. The staff have said that the children have got so much out of it and they couldn't have had better weather. They have been having a brilliant time participating in all sorts of different outdoor activities. It is an amazing opportunity for them and it helps them to really bond as a year group and with the staff at the start of their final year at St. Mary's. Thank you to Mrs Cartledge, Mr Godfrey and Mrs Lee for taking them – they will be looking forward to a quiet weekend!

Our **PTfA** are holding their AGM on Wednesday at 7.15pm in the school hall. They have a new committee and need your support to plan their exciting fundraising ideas. Please go along if you can – many hands make light work and any involvement in the PTfA, no matter how small, will really enrich the opportunities your children have at St. Mary's School. Help us make the school even better!

Many parents and members of the community will have very fond memories of **Gerry Lewis**, former Headteacher at St. Mary's School who sadly passed away last week. Gerry was Headteacher here from 1998 to 2004 and people who knew him always speak very highly of him – commenting on what a lovely man he was. I am unsure of funeral arrangements but I hope to send representation from St. Mary's School.

We are offering a significant number of after **school clubs** at the moment the majority of which are being run by staff. I appreciate that the clubs fill up very quickly and some parents and children have been very disappointed at not being able to secure a place. I know how frustrating it can be if this happens despite your best efforts to get onto the system however I think the problem is more to do with not having enough spaces for the number of children who wish to participate. It is fantastic that so many children want to do clubs after school and I will talk to the staff about how we can make after school activities more accessible to more children. Apologies in the meantime if your child was disappointed. Please note that if your child has secured a place at a club we expect them to attend for the full period that the club is running and we have high expectations of behaviour. This is a lesson in 'stickability' – if you agree to do something you need to follow it through. If children don't turn up for clubs they do risk losing their place.

Some of our children are desperate for an after school **<u>football club</u>**. If anyone feels they could spare the time to run one please let me know.

Miss Snell would also like to have more children in her after school club. If any parents would like to help Miss Snell after the Christmas break every week on Mondays after school, another <u>netball club</u> can be run along side the current club, opening up more spaces.









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**Mrs Bell** is recovering well after her surgery however she will be off for a while yet as her recovery will be slow. If parents would like to make a contribution towards a gift for Mrs Bell, Adelle Mustoe (Connor and Maci's Mum) is arranging a collection. 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#### Music Tuition 2019/2020 – KS2

Places still available for Flute , clarinet and recorder for KS2, please contact the school office if you would like your child to have a taster sessions. Mrs Stephen Hudd will be showing the children her instruments in service next week.

#### **Flute/Clarinet Tuition**

Mrs Stephens-Hudd will teach flute/clarinet lessons on a Tuesday afternoon. These lessons are available to children in Year 4, 5 and 6. Mrs Stephens-Hudd will teach children in individual, 10 minute, lessons at a cost of £5 per lesson. Therefore, the cost per group of 10 lessons will be £50. If your child doesn't have their own flute/clarinet one can be hired from Gloucestershire County Council at a cost of approximately £28 per term (10 lessons). Please contact the School Office for a hire form.

#### **Recorder Tuition**

Mrs Stephens-Hudd will teach recorder lessons on a Tuesday afternoon. These lessons are available to children in Years 3 to 6. Mrs Stephens-Hudd will teach children in individual, 10 minute, lessons at a cost of £5 per lesson. Therefore the cost per group of 10 lessons will be £50. Your child will need their own recorder and a recorder lesson book (which costs around £4.00).

### Milk









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Reception Children whose parents/carers have registered them for Free school milk (under 5's), are receiving milk in class at the moment, it is not an automatic registration. If you would like to take advantage of the free school milk scheme, please register your child at <u>www.CoolMilk.co.uk.</u>

As your children turn five this will become chargeable and an invoice will be sent to the parent/carer from Coolmilk.

If you do not want your child to receive milk in school, the parent/carer will need to cancel it. This should be done via Coolmilk. We are unable to do this in the school office. For further information please look at the coolmilk website or contact the school office.

### Free school meals – apply now

Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, our school will received extra funding if your child is eligible.

The free school meals policy is as follows-

Children might be able to get free school meals if they or their parents get any of the following:

- \* Income Support
- \* income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- \* income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- \* support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- \* the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- \* Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
  - \* Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

\* Universal Credit - your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

We receive extra funding for each eligible child registered. So even if you don't want your child to have school lunches, you still need to apply to make sure our school receives all the government funding to which is it entitled – helping us provide your child with the best education and support. 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# Help us create a Bluebell Trail

Community Planting Day - 10am to 12noon, Saturday 21st September 2019

Tetbury Town Council and the Tetbury Feoffees are partnering the Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust in its 'Wild Towns' scheme across eight towns in Gloucestershire. In Tetbury the scheme will be focussed on the Rail Lands, to improve the stream bed, waterflows, biodiversity and public access. The scheme is valued at £40,000 comprising £20K European money, £10K from the Town Council and £10K from the Feoffees. The Wildlife Trust will provide a Project Manager because it has the economies of scale to do so across the county; meaning that the Tetbury Council Taxpayer will pay only a quarter of the project cost to benefit from £40,000 of improvement work, delivered by professionals.

Part of the overall project in Tetbury is the creation of a Bluebell Trail along the old rail track.

What can you do to be part of this?

- On Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> September we want volunteers (local families and their children, and local groups) to plant thousands of bluebell bulbs along the Rail Lands.
- Volunteers should come dressed for gardening and equipped with their own garden trowels
- In advance of the day, we will put in some numbered stakes and map them.
- Arriving at any time from 10am to 12noon, each group will be given: (a) a map or plan showing all the stakes/planting locations; (b) their own stake number; and (c) a bag or boxful of bluebell bulbs.
- Our volunteers then go off to find their allocated stake and plant their bulbs in the immediate area.
- We then wait for April-May 2020 to enjoy the spectacle of our new Bluebell Trail.
