It has been over three years since our last Ofsted inspection and we are anticipating a visit in the near future. As part of the inspection process inspectors are keen to know what the parents think of their primary school and they take this into consideration when writing their report. Free school uniform and support for your child!!

As you may know we receive funding from the Government to provide additional support for every child who is registered for Free School Meals. This funding doesn't just provide your child with free school meals but is also used to enhance your child's whole primary school experience, including pastoral and educational needs. If your child is eligible they will attract this support every year, for the whole of their time at primary school, even if your situation subsequently changes. Universal Infant Free School Meals is different to Free School Meals and does not attract this same support and funding.

If your child is in Reception, KS1 or KS2 and you think your child/ren may be eligible for Free School Meals and this support please check by logging on to www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals (you will also need your national insurance number). You can check your child's eligibility at any time and if you are not eligible today but your situation changes it is worth rechecking their eligibility.

If you have any questions about this support you can discuss it confidentially with Mrs Silins. We will fund a school jumper and tie for all children who are registered for Free School Meals from 1st September 2018



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Pumpkin Soup

4 tbsp olive oil
2 onions, finely chopped
1 tsp chilli flakes, optional
1kg pumpkins peeled, deseeded and chopped into chunks
700ml vegetable stock or chicken stock
142ml pot double cream
handful pumpkin seeds

- Heat 2 this olive oil in a large saucepan, gently cook the onions and chilli flakes if used for 5 mins, until soft.
- Add 1kg of prepared pumpkin to the pan and cook for 8-10 minutes, stirring occasionally until it starts to soften and turn golden.
- Pour 700ml vegetable stock into the pan, season with salt and pepper.
 Bring to the boil and simmer for 10 mins until the pumpkin is very soft.
 Pour the cream into the pan, bring to the boil and purée with a blender.
 The soup can be kept frozen for 2 months.
- Heat 2 they olive oil in a frying pan and add a handful of pumpkin seeds to the pan and toast for a few minutes. These can then be stored in an airtight container and scattered on top of the soup before serving.
