Some of our pupils have already brought the subject up in class and the teachers have had discussions with their pupils. It is not something we can ignore however teachers are professionals and they know how to hold age-appropriate conversations with children about difficult topics whilst offering reassurance. We have had a lot of experience of this during the pandemic. We are planning to do some fund raising for charities specifically supporting people affected by the war in Ukraine. Further details of this will be sent out in due course.






