Dear Parents,

An initial analysis shows some very positive headlines with 95% of parents saying that their child enjoys school and 96% of parents saying that the quality of teaching is good – which is great news and a real tribute to the hard work of the teaching staff at the school. The Governors are in the process of collating the information and we will communicate the outcomes to parents as soon as possible. We will use the outcomes from the parents' questionnaire to inform our school development plan and I will work with the governors and parents to see how we can address any issues raised.
