Dear Parents,

We have reached the end of Term 3 already and what busy term it has been. Teacher Strikes

Lunches will be available for children eligible for benefits related free school meals - further information will be sent out to parents about booking and collecting these on the Monday after half term.

The next industrial action has been planned for 15th and 16th of March. Please be aware that the school may be closed or partially closed on those days. I will let parents know what the arrangements will be as soon as possible.

Poppy will be leading an Ash Wednesday service in school on Wednesday 1st March. Poppy will be explaining about how sometimes Christians have the sign of the cross marked in ash on their forehead on Ash Wednesday and children will be invited to do this. 

Press Release Children and young people across the Cotswolds can enjoy free activities this February Half term

The Cotswold Youth Network working in partnership with Cotswold District Council and local community organisation World Jungle will be delivering a programme of holiday activities for eligible children across the Cotswold district this half term.

Children in the Cotswold will have access to free activities during the half term holidays with activities such as circus skills, rally driving, archery, forest skills holiday camps right across the district from Fairford to Chipping Campden

Helen Edwards (Deputy Director of Primary Care and Place from NHS Gloucestershire) said: "Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board received funds from NHS England South West Region this winter in recognition of the impact that the rise in the cost of living may have on health over the coming months. In Cotswold district we are delighted to issue some funding to support an additional Holiday and Activity fund programme in February half term to benefit eligible children and families.

Ben Ward Director World Jungle said: "Our previous holiday programme have been a great success, and it's great that this is recognised by other organisations and to have secured additional funds to run this during the half term is fantastic. It will no doubt be a big help to those impacted by the cost-of-living crisis. We have an incredible range of providers across the Cotswolds so we are confident there will be something for all ages in all areas. "

The Half term activity programme will run between 20th – 24th February in venues across the Cotswold . The programme, which has strict guidelines on eligibility, is only accessible for those children in school reception class and up to year eleven, who receive benefits-related free school meals.

However, using grant funding we are also able to run the Holiday Activity Programme (HAP) which means there will be some activities which are open to all children and young people including a special programme in Tetbury and a free community fun day in Cirencester on Friday 24th February.
