Dear Parents,

I would like to thank all parents for being so understanding about the protective measures we have in place at school. I have received so many positive emails and messages about the things we are doing in school to keep the children safe and we are very appreciative of your support.

We are continuing to adhere to the government's guidelines on handwashing which states:

'Schools must ensure that pupils clean their hands regularly, including when they arrive at school, when they return from breaks, when they change rooms and before and after eating. Regular and thorough hand cleaning is going to be needed for the foreseeable future.'

Some parents have mentioned that their children's hands are getting dry and sore from the hand washing. I have attached some information from the British Skin Foundation - they recommend that children use moisturiser if their skin is becoming overly dry. If you are concerned about dry or chapped hands - please send moisturiser in. The teachers will do their best to ensure that the children dry their hands thoroughly. In the meantime, I will see if there are measures we can take at school to improve the situation.

Christmas

We are three weeks away from the end of term and we are looking forward to celebrating Christmas in a Covid secure way at school! Mrs Pike has been appointed teacher in charge of Christmas and she has worked with other staff to ensure the children still have lots of Christmas fun at school!

Children will be allowed to bring in Christmas cards but we would ask that they **only bring them in on a Monday** and put them into a box in the classroom. We will then leave the cards for 72 hours before sorting into classes and distributing them. Cards will then be given out in classes on a Friday.

In the last week of term, the children will be holding Christmas parties in the hall in their bubbles and Father Christmas *may* make an appearance at some point for our youngest children (as long as he isn't self-isolating or furloughed). The Reception children will be filming a nativity play for parents and we will also be watching a virtual pantomime in our bubbles on Wednesday. We will be having our Christmas lunch on Thursday along with a Christmas jumper day (£1 for PTA funds please). We hope to do some Christmas singing outside and every class is going to decorate their classroom door in the weirdest, wackiest way for a Christmas decorated door competition. We will end the term with a virtual Christmas service with readings and carols.

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As we're in lockdown I've been online shopping. I'm a bit concerned about buying goods without seeing them first. What happens if something goes wrong, or if I change my mind after seeing something in reality? I don't have money to lose right now.

You're not alone being cautious about shopping online. Over the last year Citizens Advice Consumer Service has dealt with just under 123,000 cases in relation to online shopping.

Most of the time, when you buy something online you automatically get a 14-day 'cooling-off period' which starts the day after you receive your order. There doesn't need to be anything wrong with the item for you to get a refund. Many online sellers may offer more time, so make sure you check the terms and conditions before purchasing.

If you do decide to return your item, you need to tell the seller you don't want the item within 14 days of receiving it. Once you've told the seller, you've got 14 days to send it back. The seller has to pay you the refund within 14 days from when they receive the item.

If you buy something online and the product is faulty (i.e. it's broken, unusable or doesn't match what was advertised), you have 30 days to ask for a refund from when you receive it. However, you can choose to accept a replacement or repair. After 30 days (and before six months) the seller must offer you a repair within a reasonable timeframe. If this isn't possible, they must offer you a replacement or a refund. Ask the seller for the easiest way to send the item back. You shouldn't have to pay.

If you order something and it doesn't arrive, it's the seller's responsibility to make sure the item is delivered to you. If the seller used a courier, they should chase the courier to find out what's happened to your order - it's not your responsibility.
