Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the start of the new academic year. I hope you all had fantastic summer holidays. I have enjoyed hearing about what the children have been up to - it sounds like so many of them have enjoyed holidays, camping trips, days out and fun at home with friends and family.

We have welcomed Mrs Hamilton into school as our new Lime class teacher and Head of Early Years and we also welcome Mrs Doherty who has joined us as a teaching assistant. Our new Reception children have really settled in well and they have been having lots of fun learning and playing with their friends and getting to know our school. I am so impressed at how well they come into the hall to eat their lunches, sitting together and chatting away!

We have introduced a new phonics scheme this year. We no longer use Read Write Inc and we have switched to Essential Letters and Sounds. Mrs Hamilton and the teachers have held an online phonics meeting for parents - if you were unable to attend and you would like more information about the new phonics scheme, we will be holding some reading breakfasts later in the term when we can show you some of the resources.

We will be saying goodbye to Mr Knight at the end of the month. Mr Knight has been a huge part of St. Mary's School for many years and we would like to thank him for everything he has done for the children over the years. We wish him every success.

Please can parents ensure that children who are riding bikes to school are encouraged to show consideration to pedestrians. Some children are cycling on the pavements and are not behaving safely. Also, I would ask parents who are dropping off at school to show consideration to other road users. Please do not stop in the middle of the road and hold up other traffic as we get complaints from residents. Thank you.

Can I remind parents that all children need wellies and a coat in school. The weather is slightly unpredictable at the moment, but we still like to keep them out on the field.

We would like to congratulate Miss Browning who is expecting a baby! Miss Browning anticipates starting her maternity leave at Christmas and I will be recruiting her replacement in the coming weeks. I understand that parents will naturally be worried when children have a change of teacher in the middle of the year, but please be assured we will do everything possible to make it a smooth transition.

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## Flu (nasal) immunisation

The Immunisation team will be in school for 3 days from Wednesday 25th October to Friday 27th October. This programme is open to every child in our school.

## **Swimming lessons**

Swimming lessons will now be on Wednesday afternoons, taking place at Malmesbury Leisure Centre. The voluntary contribution for swimming is £4.75 per week.

Elm class children will start swimming lessons on <u>Wednesday</u> 20<sup>th</sup> September **for 6 sessions as follows: 20<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> September, 4th, 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> October.** 

Swimming is part of the National Curriculum for PE which says each child should be able to swim at least 25 metres by the end of Key Stage 2.

#### Milk

Reception Children whose parents/carers have registered them for Free school milk (under 5's), are receiving milk in class at the moment, it is not an automatic registration. If you would like to take advantage of the free school milk scheme (for under 5's), please register your child at <a href="https://www.CoolMilk.co.uk">www.CoolMilk.co.uk</a>.

As your children turn five this will become chargeable and an invoice will be sent to the parent/carer from Coolmilk.

If you do not want your child to receive milk in school, the parent/carer will need to cancel it. This should be done via Coolmilk. We are unable to do this in the school office. For further information please look at the coolmilk website or contact the school office.

#### Free school Meals (FSM)

If your child is not receiving free school meals at the moment and you think you may be eligible – apply now!

Please do not reapply if you are already receiving FSM.

All children in KS1 receive Universal Free School Meals (UFSM) which you do not have to apply for. However, it is worth checking if your child is eligible for FSM. Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, we will received extra funding if your child is eligible there is a deadline for school funding so please apply now, you will need your National Insurance number to hand and your childs date of birth.





Citizens Advice Stroud and Cotswold Districts needs volunteers now more than ever to help make a difference to local people. In the last year we have faced an unprecedented demand due to the cost-of-living crisis.

We are appealing for new volunteers from all backgrounds who are looking for a volunteering role that is both challenging and rewarding. We are looking for people who can give 8-10 hours per week, and are currently recruiting for the following roles:

**Administration/Triage Assistants**. You will provide a professional welcome to callers at the door of our Stroud or Cirencester offices. You will triage callers without an appointment - identifying emergencies and providing information and signposting to other agencies when needed (no advice giving involved). You will also undertake a wide range of administrative tasks, including contacting clients by telephone and text, and handling inward and outbound post.

You must be computer literate but full training in triage and our IT systems will be given.

**Volunteer Advisers.** You will give advice and information (face to face, by telephone and email) to clients on a wide range of problems. No prior advice experience is necessary as full training will be given. Information sessions for volunteer advisers will take place on 18 October 2023 (2-3.30pm) in Stroud and on 8 November 2023 (1–2.30 pm) in Cirencester. Our next training programme will start on 24 January 2024.

Elizabeth Hall, our Chief Executive Officer said:

"Now more than ever, you can really make a difference by volunteering with us. We're seeing more and more people needing support as living costs spiral. As well as helping the local community, we know people who volunteer their time get a lot back. We'll give you all the training you need and would love to hear from you."
