# Photo Day is Coming!

This year we are able to cater for family siblings - therefore if you would like pre-school or secondary school children's photos taken with their sibling/s - please come to the school office for 8.15am on Wednesday 5th October and the photos will be taken on a first come first served basis with priority of secondary school siblings - so they are not late for their registration.

All family preschool and secondary school sibling photos will have to be completed by 9am, so please come early so you are not disappointed.

Siblings within our school will have their photos taken during the school day so you do not need to come early – usual start time.

On the day your child will be given a card from colorfoto - please use this card to register your email address as soon as possible - By registering, this ensures you will receive an email from colorfoto to let you know when you can view the proof photo (the proof will usually be available to view approx. 3 weeks after the photo is taken).

Once you have the email from Colorfoto telling you the proof is ready to view, you will have a week to order your photos to school for free, the deadline for ordering to school will be on your email from colorfoto.

Once ordered - Photos should be delivered to school from Monday 28th November.

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## **If you are not receiving Free school meals** - **apply for Free school meals now** - instant decision Apply for free school meals - Gloucestershire County Council

Please apply now – there is still time to apply and benefit from the £15 per child food voucher available for the October half term holiday. (please note Universal Free school meals for Reception to year 2, does not entitle you to the £15 per child voucher- please see below;

Gloucestershire County Council is providing £15 food vouchers, for the October half term holiday week, for all children that are eligible for Free School Meals (different to Universal Infant Free School Meals which all children in R, Yr 1 and Yr 2 receive).

• If your child is eligible for benefits related Free School Meals please read the message below the regarding these vouchers and how to register for them. You will need to make sure you have registered for these vouchers before 11th October. If your child is not currently registered for Free School Meals but you think you might be eligible for them please go to this link to get an instant decision Apply for free school meals - Gloucestershire County Council . Please do this even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 as benefits related Free School Meals entitle you to other benefits including support in the school holidays. You will need your National Insurance Number and you will get an instant response confirming if you are eligible or not. If this system confirms that you are eligible for Free School Meals please let the School Office know by replying to this email or emailing admin@st-marys-tetbury.gloucs.sch.uk

#### Information Provided by Gloucestershire County Council - £15 Food Vouchers

This October half term, Gloucestershire County Council is providing vouchers to eligible families who have signed up to our Holiday Free School Meals (FSM) scheme. These vouchers are provided by Gloucestershire County Council as part of its commitment to 'no child goes hungry'. The vouchers are funded through grant funding we have received and is separate to that of the term time free school meals. who

#### The scheme is for children in reception to year 11 who

receive benefits-related free school meals and attend a school in Gloucestershire. We are unable to consider college and sixth form students as well as children who receive universal free school meals, as they are not eligible for this scheme

Families signed up to the scheme will receive £15 per child, for the week half term.









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#### Parents who have signed up previously do not need

to re-register, they will already have been included. To ensure we reach all those who are eligible, we are encouraging parents that have not previously signed up, to sign up as soon as they can.

If you have a child who started Reception this year and you would like to add to your existing application of the scheme, please get in contact by emailing childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk so that we may update your details, as this is not an automatic process.

Applications for Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers for the October half term period are now open until the 11 October. Voucher emails will be sent out on 19 October. Please check their junk/spam email folders during this period as sometimes the vouchers end up there. If parents have not received their vouchers by the 19 October please email childrensfund@gloucestershire.gov.uk.

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#### The cost of living crisis

Here at Citizens Advice Stroud and Cotswold Districts we are seeing an increase in demand for our services as a result of the cost of living crisis.

Over the last three months we have seen a 92% increase in requests for charitable help from the same period last year, with people seeking help with food, fuel or hardship fund payments. Whilst the Energy Price Guarantee announced on the 8<sup>th</sup> September comes as a huge relief to households, energy bills are still very high. In winter 2021, the energy price cap was set at  $\pounds$ 1,277 for typical use. The new Price Guarantee starting on 1 October for households on typical use will be  $\pounds$ 2,500 a year.

We are very concerned about how vulnerable residents will cope this autumn and winter when temperatures drop and they need to turn their heating on. Many of our clients have been unable to afford their essential costs during the summer months. We have already had clients on prepayment meters who do not have enough credit to run medical equipment that relies on electricity; clients who cannot afford to heat their water; parents who are skipping meals to feed their children and pensioners unable to afford their fuel bills. In our largely rural districts, many residents rely on oil for heating and hot water and we have been contacted by people who cannot afford the cost of the minimum order.

#### What to do if you are worrying about money

If you are worried about paying your bills there are a few simple things you can do:

- 1. Work out your budget. Find out exactly how much you have coming in, and what's going out, and think about where you may be able to make savings. There is a useful budgeting tool on the national Citizens Advice website (https://www.citizensadvice.org.uk) to help you.
- 2. If you don't think you can pay your energy bills, contact your supplier. There are schemes to help customers but if you don't tell them you are struggling then they can't help you.
- 3. If you have debts, look at the guidance on debt on the national Citizens Advice website.
- 4. Check if you might be entitled to any benefits. If you have internet access you can use Turn2Us, Entitledto or Policy in Practice benefit calculators to check what you might get.



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5. Make sure you have received any cost

of living payments that you are entitled to. If you are in council tax Band A-D property you should have received a rebate on your council tax and if you are a pensioner, on benefits or disabled there are various payments that you should be receiving.

If you cannot access the internet please call us on our freephone number 0808 800 0510 to access advice.

If you are really struggling and don't have enough food to eat you can call the Trussell Trust Help through Hardship Helpline on **08082 082138**.

Please do ask for help – we understand that these are worrying times.

You can get advice by calling us on our freephone number (**0808 800 0510**) and email advice through our local website (<u>https://www.citizensadvice-stroudandcotswold.org.uk/</u>) under the Get Help section. We are also seeing clients by appointment in our Stroud and Cirencester offices and in the community at various venues across both districts – currently Dursley, Paganhill Community Hub, Stonehouse APT, Wotton under Edge and Moreton in Marsh and Tetbury. We are also looking for new volunteers to train as admin assistants in both our Cirencester and Stroud offices – if you are interested please email <u>info@ca-scd.org.uk</u>.
