## Flu (nasal) immunisation - update

Due to the Government deadline having all children in schools immunised by 15<sup>th</sup> December, the immunisation team will now be in school for 2 days not 3 days, Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> October and Thursday 26<sup>th</sup> October 2023, any children that are not in on these days will be given a letter with information on where you can attend a catch up clinic.

We do require all parents to complete the form with their chosen **yes** or **no** box ticked . If you child's has not brought home a letter please collect a letter from the school office and return as soon as possible. If you do not complete a form the school nurse team will ring you and this takes time off of immunising children whose parents have returned the forms.

## Swimming lessons - the bus bay must be kept clear for the returning coach every Wednesday afternoon.

Swimming lessons will now be on Wednesday afternoons, taking place at Malmesbury Leisure Centre. The voluntary contribution for swimming is £4.75 per week. Swimming is part of the National Curriculum for PE which says each child should be able to swim at least 25 metres by the end of Key Stage 2.

Elm class children are currently having their lessons which started on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> September for 6 sessions as follows: 20<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> September, 4<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> & 25<sup>th</sup> October.

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## School Photo – update – register for notifications



Individual photos and family photos were taken on 4th October - You should have received a card with details on how to register for notifications when the photos are ready to view. If you have not received this please contact the school office as you will only have limited time to order free delivery to the school.

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## Milk

Reception Children whose parents/carers have registered them for Free school milk (under 5's), are receiving milk, in class at the moment, however it is not an automatic registration. If you would like to take advantage of the free school milk scheme (for under 5's), please register your child at [www.CoolMilk.co.uk](http://www.CoolMilk.co.uk).

As your children turn five, this will become chargeable and an invoice will be sent to the parent/carer from Coolmilk.

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If you do not want your child to receive milk in school, the parent/carer will need to cancel it. This should be done via Coolmilk. We are unable to do this in the school office. For further information please look at the coolmilk website or contact the school office.

## Free school Meals (FSM)

If your **child is not** receiving free school meals at the moment and you think you may be eligible – apply now!

Please do not reapply if you are already receiving FSM.

All children in KS1 receive Universal Free School Meals (UFSM) which you do not have to apply for. However, it is worth checking if your child is eligible for FSM. Even if your child is in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, we will receive extra funding if your child is eligible, you will need your National Insurance number to hand and your child's date of birth.

We receive extra funding for each eligible child registered. So even if you don't want your child to have school lunches, you still need to apply to make sure our school receives all the government funding to which it is entitled – helping us provide your child with the best education and support. ## Peripatetic Music lessons

### New Violin (yr 2 - yr 6)

If we have enough interest, Gloucestershire Music will be able to set this up for us. Lessons will take place on an afternoon to be confirmed.

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## OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning)

Fascinating FACT: Did you know, children spend about 1.4 years of their primary school attendance at playtime? That’s about 20% of their time with us at St Mary’s. Play is quite clearly a significant part of their education from Reception through to Year 6.

As a school we are very keen to improve the play experiences of children across the school, and we embarked on a fantastic project to transform break and lunchtimes for the children. The project is being supported by a company called OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning). Lots of information about it can be found at the website <http://outdoorplayandlearning.org.uk>. In a nutshell, it involves providing children with as wide a range of equipment as possible, which the children then use in creative ways to play together. It is less about teaching children how to play and more about giving them wider opportunities – after all, our children are play ‘experts’! It also involves the children using our school grounds, including the field, throughout the year. We have welly boot shelters/stores installed to help with this.

If you are able to provide any items from the list below, we would be very grateful. Some items might seem strange to have in school, but rest assured the creativity of our children will put it to good use!

We are appealing for new volunteers from all backgrounds who are looking for a volunteering role that is both challenging and rewarding. We are looking for people who can give 8-10 hours per week, and are currently recruiting for the following roles:

**Administration/Triage Assistants.** You will provide a professional welcome to callers at the door of our Stroud or Cirencester offices. You will triage callers without an appointment - identifying emergencies and providing information and signposting to other agencies when needed (no advice giving involved). You will also undertake a wide range of administrative tasks, including contacting clients by telephone and text, and handling inward and outbound post.

You must be computer literate but full training in triage and our IT systems will be given.

**Volunteer Advisers.** You will give advice and information (face to face, by telephone and email) to clients on a wide range of problems. No prior advice experience is necessary as full training will be given. Information sessions for volunteer advisers will take place on 18 October 2023 (2-3.30pm) in Stroud and on 8 November 2023 (1-2.30 pm) in Cirencester. Our next training programme will start on 24 January 2024.

Elizabeth Hall, our Chief Executive Officer said:

“Now more than ever, you can really make a difference by volunteering with us. We’re seeing more and more people needing support as living costs spiral. As well as helping the local community, we know people who volunteer their time get a lot back. We’ll give you all the training you need and would love to hear from you.”
